Spotlight on Service

Our weekly look at the service learning projects completed by the Class of 2021.



Anna Cook '21 traveled to the British Virgin Islands part of her service project, volunteering through GoBeyond, a non-profit specializing in placing high school volunteers in communities around the world. Anna and 12 other teenagers spent three weeks working at a school, helping to repair its roof, doors and walls, as well as playing sports with the school children. 
