

Ellie Westby '21 likes being around - and learning from - children, especially when she can help teach them in the process. Her service led her to Easter Seals of Greater Houston's Camp Buckaroo, which offers recreation to children with special needs. She worked one-on-one with individual campers, helping them explore a range of activities. While Ellie admits being nervous that she wouldn't be a good counselor, she leaned into her fear and volunteered anyway. She realized that the organization, for many girls, was a safe space from other traumas in their lives. Swim went to the state meet, competing in multiple events.


The IWA soccer team made the playoffs for the first time in school history. They finished 5th in their district with a record of 10-5 and are looking forward to next season.
